Teaching Artists incorporate movement, voice, improvisation, cooperative dramatic development, and stage awareness exercises to help students understand their own expression and skills. The emphasis of the class is on dramatic play, but a part of the session will focus on rehearsing a simple performance. This performance will be presented at the end of the session for a small in-studio audience. Attendance and punctuality are important for consistency. Students are encouraged to sign up for more than one term as the group will work together to create a different presentation at the end of each session.
